NEWS FROM THE BOARD

At our last meeting the Board welcomed a visit from Whaea Lyn who shared with us the learning our staff have done around SchoolTalks. This is an online planning and assessment tool that visibly tracks student progress against structured progressions so that every learner makes progress in their learning journey. SchoolTalks creates a rich record of learning that is visibly and collaboratively used by teachers, learners and eventually parents to support effective formative assessment, build student agency, and strengthen home/school partnerships. We are impressed by the work the teachers have done and it looks like this tool will not only save time and energy but will also make learning more transparent.

EDUCATION LANDSCAPE

As you will read in the attached letter written by Northern Wairoa Principals Association we continue to fight back against the current claims and education initiatives being put before us. The challenge around this when schools are already working hard to meet the needs of our learners is ongoing. You will read in the letter that we are in the midst of a teacher shortage which has hit crisis point in Northland. Numbers enrolling in teacher training has dropped dramatically in recent years and the average age of teachers shows us numbers will only decrease over the next ten years. Many jobs advertised are currently getting zero applicants.

We are incredibly fortunate here at Arapohue that we have a stable staff and with the fabulous Miss Mitchell on board we can usually cover all absence. HOWEVER, that is not always possible and as the teacher shortage continues, we may need to ask you to keep students' home if we cannot provide enough staff onsite to keep our students safe. We understand the inconvenience this would cause and would only do it as a last resort, should safety be compromised. We trust that you will support us if we ever have to take this step.

ATTENDANCE

We continue to monitor attendance and would like to acknowledge and thank you all for keeping your children at home when they are sick. This helps keep everyone else healthy – hopefully! On the other hand, classes have all set goals around their attendance and are currently counting how many full weeks they do at school. If they hit their target they will be invited to a "Pancake Breakfast" on the last day of term – the winning class with the highest stats will also receive an extra special surprise treat!!
