#### **STATIONERY**


Invoices for stationery have been sent home with students. The packs are \$25 per student and banking payment details are on the invoices – Please use student name as the payment reference.

### **NEWS FROM KĀKANO**

In Kākano we have been learning about how numbers work. Some children have been writing expanded and compact numerals. If we know about place value, it is much easier to add two digit numbers. While others are learning to remember which numbers go together to add up to ten. These are the ten twins. We played a fast card game to



help us remember them. We are also learning to recognise patterns for numbers so we don't need to count them.
